Access on Site



- Access routes should be free from trip/slip fall hazards
- Routes should be free from tools and materials
- Access should be formed suitably for all, including members of the public
- End of check if access is open for public use
- Hierarchy for access level changes
- Property systems
- Designed temporary works
- Steps set to British standards - BS.



KEY POINTS

- Site welfare & offices have clear marked routes to site
- Site access segregation plant and pedestrians
- Welfare and work areas are clearly defined (From safe to risk - SAFE ZONE)
- Areas of risk communicated and controlled physically
- Level changes correctly formed and communicated.
